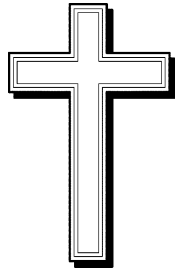

## Come, Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful

Today we celebrate one of the greatest feasts of the Church: **Pentecost**. In the Book of Genesis, God breathed life into Adam; now Christ breathes the Holy Spirit into His disciples. It is a new creation. The Spirit gives new life, new courage, and a new mission. The frightened disciples became fearless witnesses. Closed doors were opened. Silence became proclamation. Fear became courage. After receiving the Holy Spirit, Peter stands before thousands and boldly proclaims Christ. Even today many people live with fear about the future, fear of failure, rejection, sickness and speaking the truth. The Holy Spirit removes difficulties from life and He gives strength to face them.

In the book of Acts, people from many nations hear the apostles speaking in their own languages; different languages, different cultures, yet one message. Pentecost reverses the confusion of the Tower of Babel. At Babel, pride divided humanity. At Pentecost, the Spirit unites humanity from different nations, different languages, different customs, but one faith and one Spirit. St. Paul says "There are different gifts, but the same Spirit."

Pentecost is not only a past event. It must happen again in us. Sometimes our hearts are like the locked room of the apostles: closed by anger, wounded by disappointment, burdened by sin, tired and discouraged. The Holy Spirit wants to enter those closed places. He brings: peace to troubled hearts, forgiveness to sinners and hope to the discouraged, fire to lukewarm faith. A Christian without the Holy Spirit becomes spiritually cold; but a person filled with the Spirit becomes alive with faith, charity, and zeal.

How do we know the Holy Spirit is working in us? It is manifested through transformed living: patience instead of anger, forgiveness instead of revenge, kindness instead of selfishness, prayer instead of indifference, courage instead of fear. The greatest miracle of the Holy Spirit is a changed heart. Let's pray sincerely: "Come, Holy Spirit. Fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love."

**Adoration** - There is a calendar at the back of church which lists Adoration times and this is also where you can sign up. **We have added Adoration on the 2nd and 4th Fridays of the month during the summer at 9:00-11:00 am with devotional music.** We also continue to have Adoration on Tuesdays at 5:00-5:30 with rosary/chaplet and on First Fridays after 5:30 Mass.

**Parish Council Nominations-** Trent Gottschalk and Kim Diller have each served a three year term so they are eligible to be nominated again. We will have slips of paper in the pews to write down 4 to 6 people down who you think would be good to have on council. Nominations will be taken May 31 and June 7. Out of these names we will have a ballot for elections which will be on June 21 and 28. You must be a member of St John's parish and 18 or older to participate and only fill out one nomination slip.

**Church and Rectory Roofs-** Both the roofs of the church and rectory had to be replaced because we got a bad batch of shingles when it was done last time. Both roofs have been completed. We received a rebate check for \$28,615.17. We then paid a payment to Hill City Roofing of \$21,190 (65% down) for supplies and then payments of \$4621.75 (rectory) and \$4861.25 (church) upon completion of the job. So the cost to replace the roofs was \$2057.83.
